# PROCEDURES FOR ENTRY TO INDONESIA

## INDONESIA IS OPEN FOR ALL VISITORS

New rule effective June 9, 2023: Indonesian Authorities have now removed the requirement to show any form of COVID-19 vaccination proof on arrival to Indonesia or for onward domestic travel. No more proof of a pre-travel negative RT-PCR test is Health insurance is no longer required, but strongly recommended.

Update on September 10, 2024: Bringing an Antigen test kit and testing yourself upon your arrival onboard is not required anymore, but still strongly recommended. Testing yourself before leaving home and wear a mask inside airports & on the aircraft on your way to join our vessels is also recommended.

## **VISA REQUIREMENTS**

- Visa: The Government of Indonesia has now made Visa On Arrival & Visa Exemption Arrangement accessible at several points of entry. Visa On Arrival (VOA), single entry is now available for citizens of 92 nationalities for those entering Indonesia via major hubs, such as Bali, Jakarta, Manado and Makassar. VOA is valid for stay of up to 30 days and can be extended for a maximum 1 time at the local Immigration Office (charges apply). VOA cost: IDR 500,000 (approx. EUR 32 / USD 35). Payment can be done by: Visa, Mastercard or Debit Card or Cash Indonesian Rupiah (IDR). You can also apply for an Electronic Visa prior to your travel.

#### **CUSTOM DECLARATION.**

Since January 22, 2024, the Government of Indonesia now requires all visitors to complete a Customs declaration online prior to your departure. Click on <a href="this link">this link</a>, and complete the details a maximum of 4 days before your flight to Indonesia, to receive a QR code which will be scanned at the Customs Desk as you pass through, but also at the airline check-in desk for your first international flight.





### **MASK USE & TEMPERATURE CHECK**

Prior to and during the early stages of your trip, we recommend all guests wear a mask, wash hands regularly, try to avoid too much contact with others, and practice sensible social distancing where possible. We strongly recommend that a suitable face mask is worn while inside airports & on the aircraft on your way to join our vessels. Your body temperature may be checked by local health authorities upon your arrival in Indonesia.

## MANDATORY ONLINE HEALTH DECLARATION

Since August 30, 2024 and following the classification of Mpox as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) by the WHO on 14th August 2024: The Indonesian government has introduced enhanced health protocols at all entry points, especially airports, to prevent the spread of a new Mpox variant. All travellers, including both Indonesian citizens and foreign visitors, are now required to complete an electronic self-declaration form called the SATUSEHAT Health Pass, before entering the country.



After filling in the form, a QR Code and personal data information will appear. Indonesian authorities will scan the QR code on arrival in Indonesia. Save it on your smartphone or bring a printed copy with you to ensure authorities can scan it on arrival. **Note: This is to be completed up to 3 days before arriving.**
